



# Experience Mali

## The Somono neighborhood

*One of Ségou's oldest neighborhoods is the Somono neighborhood. Located along the river shore, this part of Ségou is originally inhabited by Somono (and Bozo) fishermen, who still make for the largest ethnic groups in the neighborhood.*

Quartier Somono - as it called in French - is known for its red mud buildings and traditional architecture. Set out on a walk with one of our guides. Explore the neighborhood both on the riverside and in the streets further away from the river. The river shore is a lively area where women gather for daily chores. The sand fishermen bring their daily loads of sand ashore, and boats filled to the brim with fire wood arrive. The streets breath a quiet atmosphere. Learn about the red mud, visit the Somono market (don't miss out on the colorful Fulani fabrics) and stroll along daily life. Don't be surprised to be invited for a glass of Malian tea!
